Red Hat is widely known for its enterprise operating system Red Hat Enterprise Linux. Red Hat is the leader in development, deployment, and management of Linux and open source solutions for Internet infrastructure - ranging from embedded devices to secure Web servers.

The company was founded in 1993 by Bob Young and Marc Ewing, its headquarters is located, in Raleigh, North Carolina in the US, with other offices in Ann Arbor, Atlanta, Boston, Charlotte, and Chicago. At the end of 2018, IBM announced its intent to acquire the company for \$34 billion, which closed July 2019, IBM's largest acquisition to date.

The company's business model is based on open-source software, development within a community, and subscription-based customer support. Red Hat makes money on subscriptions for customer services, training, and integration services that help enterprises in utilizing their open-source software products.

Red Hat makes, maintains, and contributes to multiple free software projects, which shows its open-source spirit. It has bought many companies with proprietary software product codebases and released the software under open source licenses. As of March 2016, Red Hat is the second-largest corporate contributor to the Linux kernel version 4.14 after Intel.

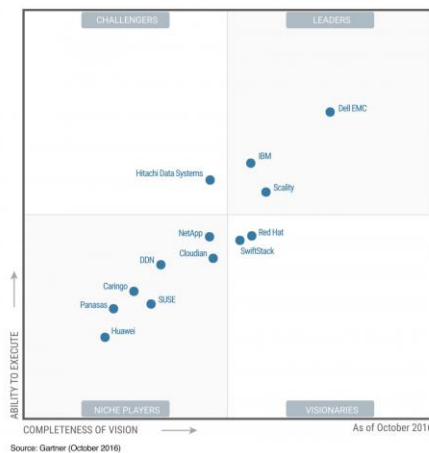
